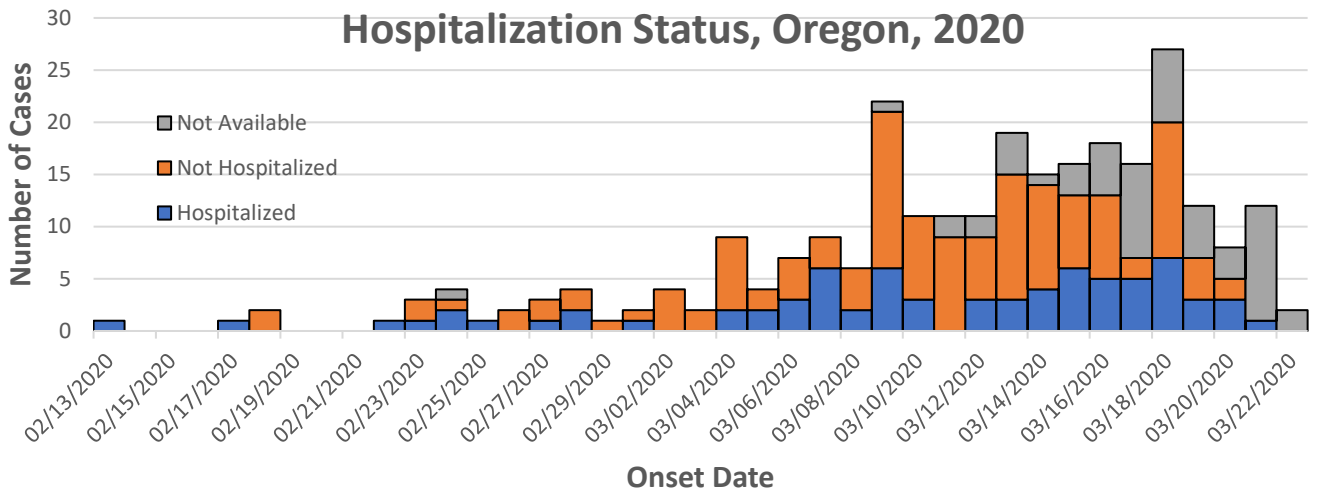

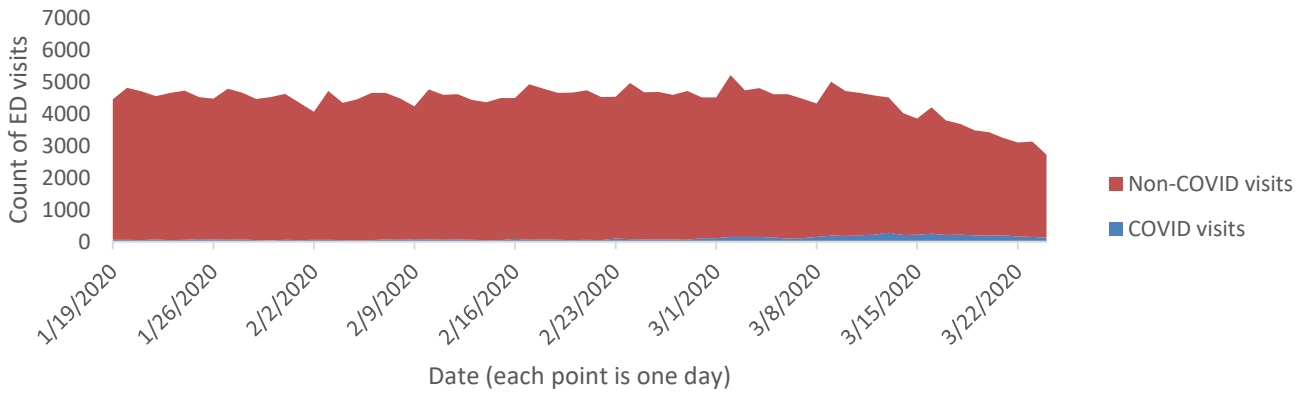

 - o Due to a server outage, the number of pending tests is not available.

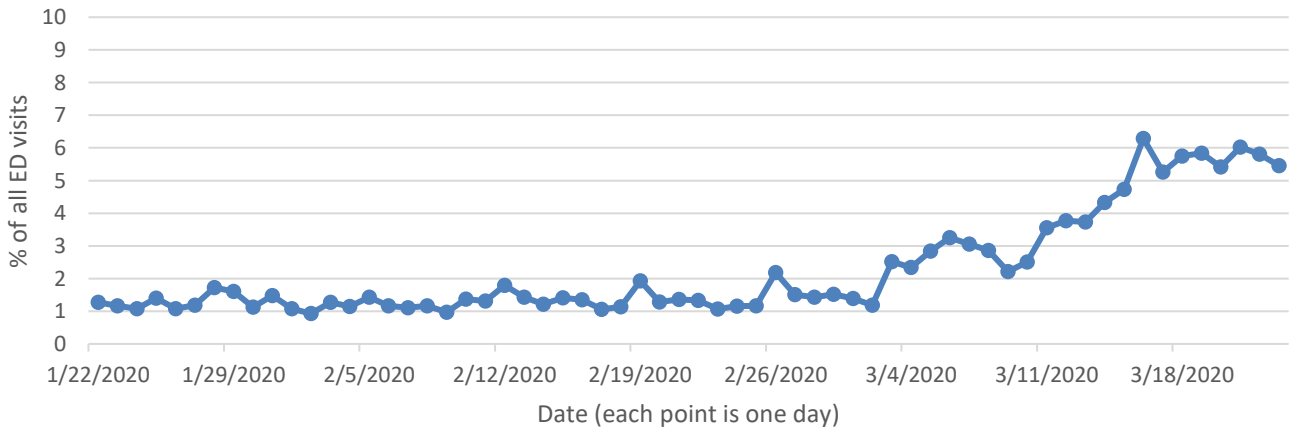
COVID-19 Cases by Symptom Onset Date and Hospitalization Status, Oregon, 2020

The PPE allocation plan will be revised during this operational period and PPE collection and distribution will be maintained by the ECC.
