## **OHA Update**

### **Oregon reports 3 new COVID-19 deaths, 58 new COVID-19 cases**

**PORTLAND, Ore.** — COVID-19 has claimed three more lives in Oregon, raising the state's death toll to 16, the Oregon Health Authority reported at 8 a.m. today.

Oregon Health Authority reported 58 new cases of COVID-19, bringing the state total to 606, as of 8 a.m. today. The new COVID-19 cases reported today are in the following counties: Benton (1), Clackamas (1), Deschutes (2), Douglas (4), Jackson (1), Josephine (4), Lane (2), Marion (14), Multnomah (9), Polk (2), Tillamook (1), Wasco (2), Washington (14), Yamhill (1).

Oregon's 14th COVID-19 death is a 91-year-old male in Yamhill County, who tested positive on March 20, and died March 29 at Providence Newberg Medical Center. He had underlying medical conditions.

Oregon's 15th COVID-19 death is an 80-year-old male in Clackamas County, who tested positive on March 22, and died March 29 at Legacy Meridian Park Medical Center. He had underlying medical conditions.

Oregon's 16th COVID-19 death is a 91-year-old male in Linn County, who tested positive on March 15, and died March 29 at the Oregon Veterans' Home in Lebanon. He had underlying medical conditions.

Lake County Sheriff

**In accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 20-12, "Stay Home, Save Lives," the Lake County Sheriff's Office is asking residents to stay in their homes. This order is effective immediately and remains in place until lifted by the Governor.**

Please leave your house only for essential activities, i.e., getting a weekly supply of groceries, picking up take-out meals, purchasing medical supplies or receiving medical care, accessing financial services, buying pet food, or getting supplies to work from home.

All non-essential gatherings are prohibited, regardless of size. Gatherings of people within the same residential household are allowed.

Playgrounds, sport courts, state parks, campgrounds, pools and other types of outdoor recreation facilities are closed.

Feel free to walk your dog, jog, or bike in your neighborhood if you can stay 6' away from other individuals.

The Lake County Sheriff's Office, Oregon State Police, and first responders continue to respond to public safety needs.

"Your Sheriff's Office is continuing to provide the public safety and customer service you all expect and deserve. Please contact us if you need assistance. Times are evolving rapidly and we understand it causes uncertainty. We appreciate your partnership as we do our part to keep our community safe and slow the spread of COVID-19. As we always do, we will share information and seek voluntary compliance as we continue to use discretion in enforcing the spirit of the law."

In response to the current COVID-19 pandemic, most Oregon transit providers are adjusting their services and schedules frequently, and quickly.
